Hiding and Unhiding Rows, Columns and Worksheet

In Microsoft Excel, you can hide and unhide rows, columns, or entire worksheets to improve organization, declutter your spreadsheet, or protect sensitive data.

There are different methods to Hide Columns and Rows.

**Method 1: Using Shortcuts**

This is the quick way to hide a row or column using shortcuts:

**Step 1: Select the Row or Column**

Click the row number or column letter to select it.

**Step 2: Use the Shortcut**

Press Ctrl + 9 to hide a row, or Ctrl + 0 to hide a column.

**Step 3: Preview Result**

Selected row or column is Hidden now.

**Method 2: Using the Right-Click Menu**

This is the easiest way to Hide Row or Column in Excel:

**Step 1: Select the Row or Column**

Click the row number or column letter of the row or column you want to hide. Here we have Selected Row "3".

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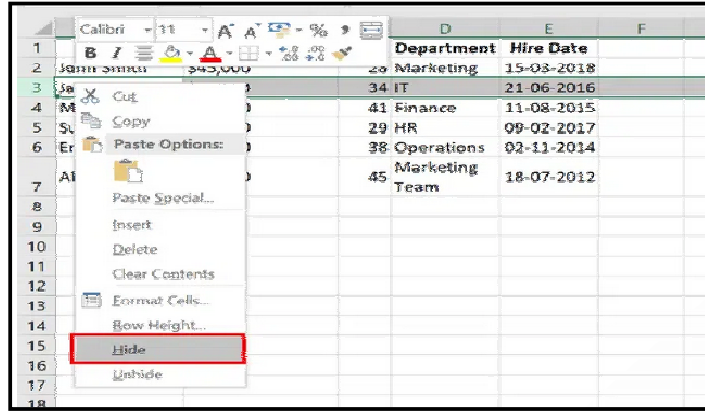
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**Step 2: Right-click and Select Hide**

Right-click on the selected row or column. From the context menu, select Hide.



**Step 3: Preview Result**

The row or column will disappear from view.

**Method 3: Using the Ribbon**

To hide a row or column using the Ribbon, follow these steps:

**Step 1: Select the Row or Column**

Click the row number or column letter to select it.

**Step 2:**

Go to the Home Tab > Cells Group > Format > Hide & Unhide > Hide the entire Row or Column.

**Step 3:**

The row or column will disappear from view.

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**How to Unhide a Row or Column in Excel**

If you've hidden rows or columns in Excel, you can easily unhide them using several methods. Here's how to unhide rows or columns step by step:

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**Method 1: Using Keyboard Shortcuts**


To quickly unhide a row or column in Excel, you can use keyboard shortcuts. This method is fast and efficient for uncovering hidden data without needing to use menus.

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**Step 1: Select Adjacent Rows or Columns**

Highlight the rows or columns next to the hidden row or column. Here Row 5 is hidden, so we have selected Row 4 and Row 6.

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**Step 2: Use the Shortcut and Preview Results**


Press **Ctrl + Shift + 9** to unhide rows

Press **Ctrl + Shift + 0** to unhide columns

This will unhide the hidden column or Rows:

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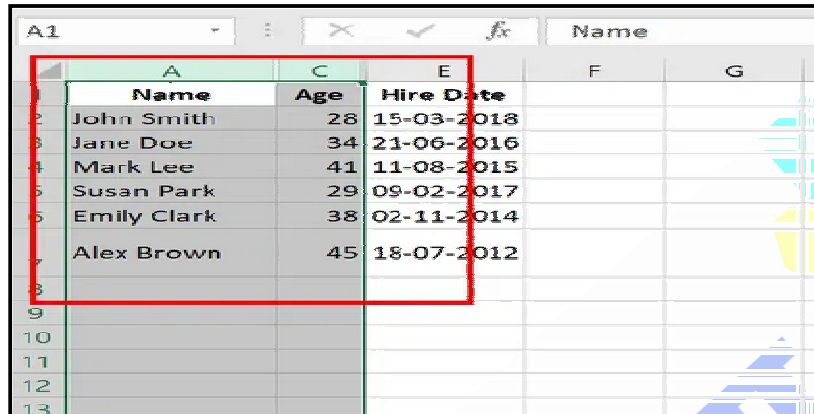
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**Method 2: Using the Ribbon**

To unhide a row or column using the Ribbon, follow these steps:

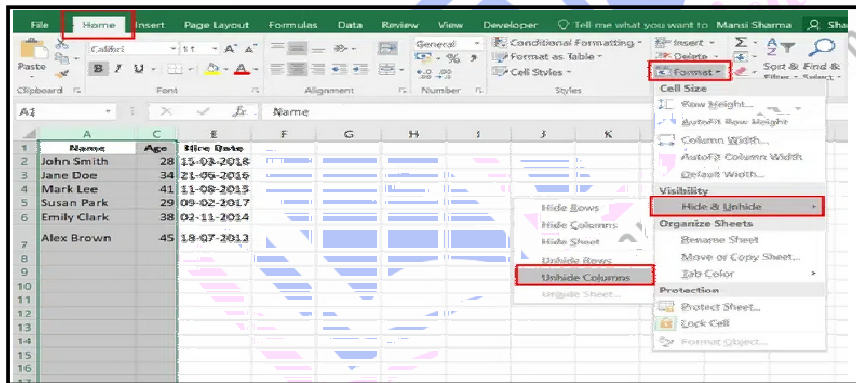
**Step 1: Select Adjacent Rows or Columns**

Highlight the rows or columns surrounding the hidden area. Here Column B is hidden so we have selected Column A and Column C.



**Step 2: Go to the Home Tab, Click on Format Drop Down, Select Hide Unhide and Choose your Option**

On the Excel ribbon, click the Home tab, In the Cells group, click the Format dropdown menu Select Hide & Unhide, and from the submenu, select either Unhide Rows or Unhide Columns.



**Alternate Method:**

After selecting the Adjacent Rows or Columns, Right click and Select Unhide. This will unhide the hidden rows or column.

**Step 3: Preview Results**

The hidden row or column will become visible.

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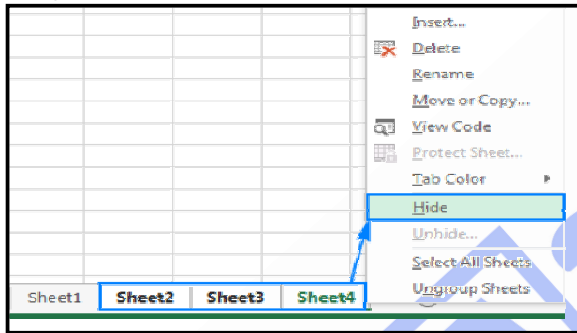

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**Hide and Unhide Worksheet in MS Excel**

- How to hide sheets in Excel by right-clicking
- Right-click the selection and choose Hide from the context menu.



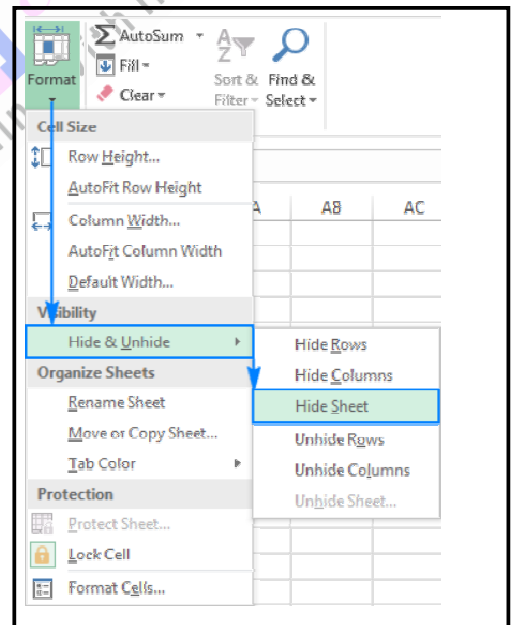
**How to select worksheets in Excel**

- To select a single sheet, click its tab.
- To select multiple contiguous sheets, click the tab of the first sheet, hold down the Shift key, and click the tab of the last sheet.
- To select multiple non-contiguous sheets, hold down the Ctrl key while clicking the sheet tabs individually.

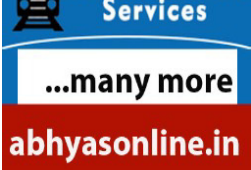
**How to hide worksheet using the ribbon**

Another way to hide worksheets in Excel is by clicking the Hide Sheet command on the ribbon. Here's how:

1. Select the sheet(s) you want to hide.
2. On the Home tab, in the Cells group, click Format.
3. Under Visibility, point to Hide & Unhide, and click Hide Sheet.



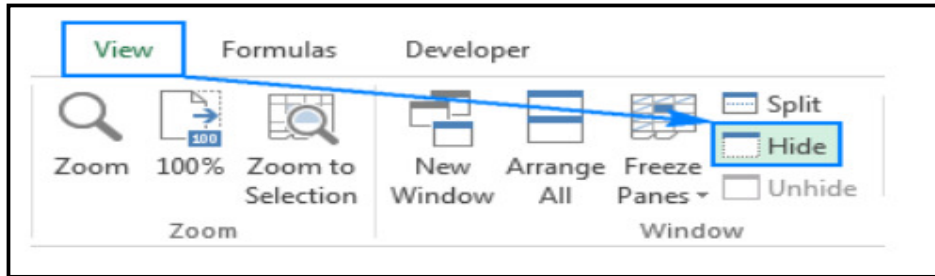
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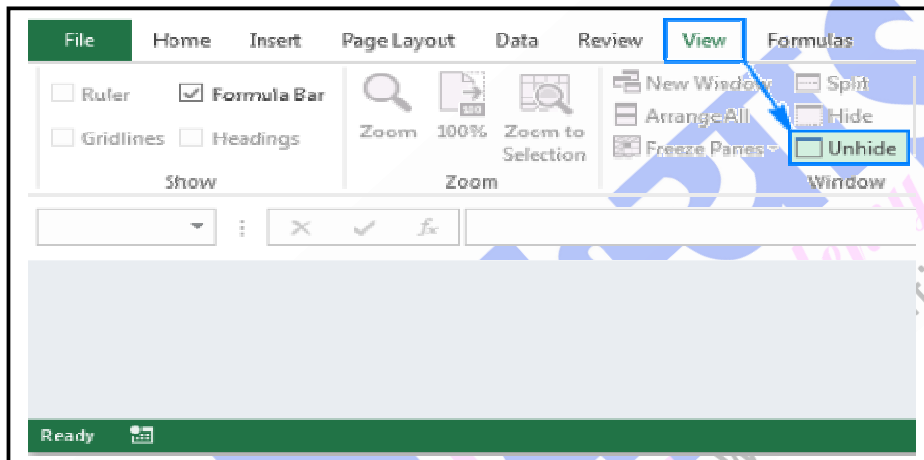
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**How to hide the workbook window**

Aside from hiding specific worksheets, Excel also enables you to hide the entire workbook window. For this, you go to the View tab > Window group, and click the Hide button.



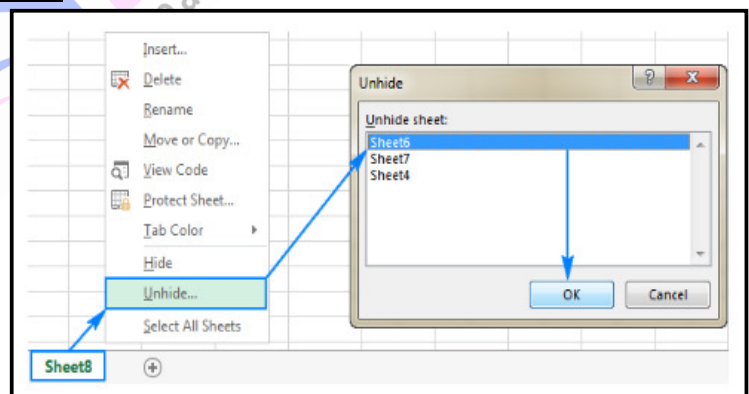
As soon as you do that, the workbook window and all sheet tabs will disappear. To get your workbook back, go to the View tab again, and click Unhide.



**How to unhide sheets in Excel**

If you want to see just one or two hidden sheets, here's how you can quickly unhide them: In your Excel workbook, right-click any sheet tab and select Unhide... from the context menu.

In the Unhide box, select the hidden sheet you want to display and click OK (or double-click the sheet name). Done!

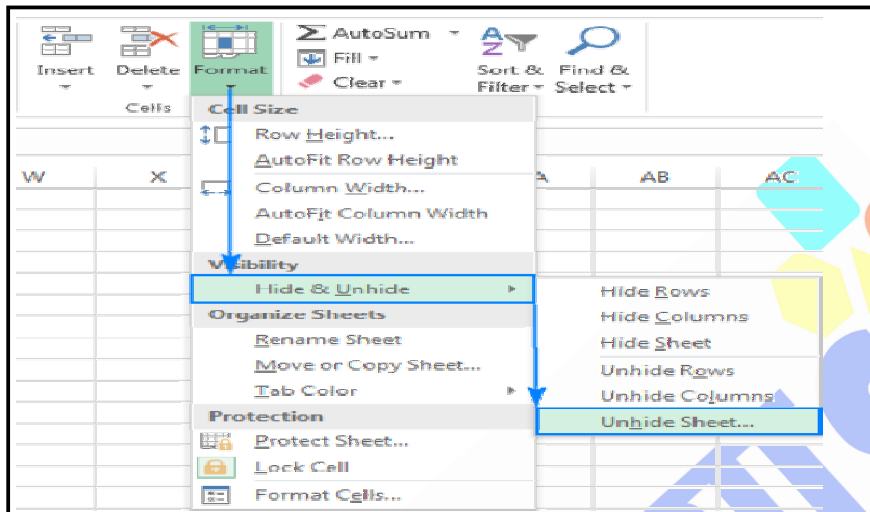


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**Hiding and Unhiding Row, Column and Worksheet in MS Excel**

**Besides the right-click contextual menu, the Unhide dialog can be accessed from the ribbon:**

Go to the Home tab > Cells group, and click the Format Under Visibility, point to Hide & Unhide, and then click Unhide Sheet.



**How to hide Row, Column and sheet with a key sequence**

**For Hide**

- Row - press Alt → H → O → U → R
- Column - press Alt → H → O → U → C
- Sheet - press Alt → H → O → U → S

**For Unhide**

- Row - press Alt → H → O → U → O
- Column - press Alt → H → O → U → L
- Sheet - press Alt → H → O → U → H

Once you press Alt, Excel will show you which key activates which menu:

H selects the Home

O opens the Format

U selects Hide and Unhide.

S selects Hide Sheet.

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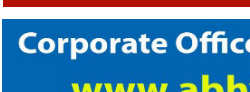
